May 18, 2023 Education Session

The Retirement Board Education Session of the Public Employees' Retirement Board meeting was called to order by Chair Stevens at 9:05 a.m., May 18, 2023, at 693 W. Nye Lane, Carson City. Members present: Mark Stevens, Brian Wallace, Jessica Colvin, Dawn Huckaby, Todd Ingalsbee (9:13 a.m.), and Cameron Wagner. Members absent: Norma Santoyo.

1. <u>PUBLIC COMMENT</u>

Daniel Coyne, Treasurer of the Las Vegas Police Protective Association, commented on their efforts regarding AB351 and a lawsuit to be brought by LVPPA.

2. <u>EDUCATION TOPIC</u>

2.1 Staff presented a history of the Public Employees' Retirement System.

- 3.3 There were no recommended changes to the Interim Investment Directives for the PERS', Legislators', and Judicial funds.
